DHFLA is here for families going through adoption and fertility treatments. And for families needing services and therapies for a loved one with special needs. And for families needing to cover expenses related to a Jewish funeral and burial.

DHFLA is here for students needing to pay down student debt or to assist with higher education expenses. And for children and teens attending Jewish camp, gap year programs, and traveling to Israel.

DHLFA is here for business owners needing to grow or sustain their small business. And for entrepreneurs launching a start-up.

DHFLA is here for individuals dealing with unexpected emergencies, home or auto repairs, medical expenses, unexpected bills, core living expenses (including *brit milah* and koshering a home), and so much more.

Our ten loan funds, servicing the Jewish communities in 18 counties across Greater North Texas, provide borrowers an affordable and dignified way to navigate financial obstacles.

Many credit card companies will charge up to 30% interest. And payday loans are much, much worse. At DHFLA, our loan process is simple: You borrow money and pay back exactly the same amount.

As we enter the 90th year of our existence, the Dallas Hebrew Free Loan Association (DHFLA) continues to serve the Greater North Texas Jewish Community by providing interest-free loans to community members in need.

The maximum loan available 90 years ago was \$10. We now offer Higher Education loans up to a total of \$32,000 over eight semesters. In 1935, \$132 was made available for these \$10 loans. Today we have nearly \$2,000,000 in total assets, including loans outstanding over \$1,350,000.

My two years as president of DHFLA have been extremely rewarding. Over that time, DHFLA provided approximately 70 new loans with a principal value of almost \$600,000. This would not have been possible without the support of our donors, board members and volunteers.

I hope you will join me to celebrate DHFLA's success on May 7, 2025 at our 90th anniversary exhibit and Zeroes are Heroes event.

I'm excited to pass the proverbial baton to our incoming president, Alan Tolmas. I'm confident Alan will lead our organization zealously as we head to our 100th anniversary.

Loan Fund Spotlight ADOPTION AND FERTILITY

A staggering one in eight couples will experience challenges achieving and maintaining pregnancy. The rate of infertility within the Jewish community is even higher at one in six! And it's expensive. The average cost for one in vitro fertilization (IVF) cycle is \$20,000!

Adoption, a life-changing experience and a source of great joy, is also expensive. In Texas, the average private adoption costs between \$60,000 and \$65,000!

At DHFLA, we never want finances to get in the way of expanding your family and your heart.

DHFLA provides interest-free loans up to \$20,000 to help cover adoption costs and fertility expenses.

Note: As with all of our loan funds, if a borrower is concerned about meeting the guarantor requirement, please contact us to discuss the circumstances. We're here to help, and we may be able to make exceptions to certain requirements.



DHFLA recognizes that individuals with special needs often have families with special financial needs.

Through a generous grant from the Fichtenbaum Charitable Trust, Bank of America, N.A., Co-Trustee, DHFLA can offer no interest loans up to \$10,000 to help families navigate diagnoses, therapies, and treatments, and to graduate students who pursue a degree in special education or a related field.

These loans can be used to help cover the cost of a variety of services associated with supporting an individual with special needs. Diagnostic evaluations not fully covered by insurance, behavioral intervention, speech and occupational therapy, psychiatric care, school shadows or other educational support services, home care for individuals with neurological or behavioral issues, treatments not covered by insurance for individuals with serious diseases, and more are included.

Loans for graduate students can be used to cover education expenses related to a degree in special education or a related field such as behavior analysis, a specialization as a developmental doctor and more.

Loan Fund Spotlight JEWISH EXPERIENCE

Our Jewish Experience loans are for children and youth to attend activities and programs that will deepen their Jewish heritage and strengthen their connection to the Jewish community -- which is especially important in this environment of rising antisemitism.

Our no interest loans up to \$3,500 can also be used for b'nei mitzvah expenses, koshering a home, brit milah, and more, in addition to overnight and day camps, high school or gap years in Israel, Israel and Jewish teen travel, and Jewish youth group activities.

These loans enable members of our Jewish community to participate in experiences that engage them in Jewish life and strengthen their Jewish identity.



Israel's economy has been thrown into turmoil since the outbreak of war. The war has affected hundreds of small businesses. Families and individuals are facing financial distress due to loss of homes, loved ones, and livelihoods. Israel's nonprofit sector is also under strain. The financial pressures facing the people of Israel are intensifying. Ogen, DHFLA's Israeli counterpart, experienced a surge in demand for loans from individuals and families due to the attacks and ongoing conflict.

Making no interest loans to international nonprofits from our reserves is not part of DHFLA's normal operations, but these are not ordinary times. DHFLA, in partnership with the DJCF and contributions from the Dallas community, contributed over \$133,000 to this historic effort. The funds were allocated to an emergency loan fund which disbursed 350 loans with an average size of \$10,000. These 350 loans assisted approximately 1,225 people including reservists, evacuees, and individuals who experienced loss of income and property damage.

Through September 2024, the loans made through this emergency effort have a 100% repayment rate – a testament to the no interest loan model of community support.
